Today, we hear Jesus call Himself the Good Shepherd, and it's such a comforting image. In a noisy, chaotic world, He reminds us that we are not alone-we're known, seen, and protected. Whether we're leading or following, what matters most is that we stay close to the Shepherd who leads us to life. Do we recognize His voice today?
